Genesis 1: 29-31

God said, “See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth and to every bird of the air and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food.” And it was so. God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good.

Deuteronomy 11: 13-15

“If you will only heed his every commandment^b that I am commanding you today—loving the LORD your God and serving him with all your heart and with all your soul then he will give the rain for your land in its season, the early rain and the later rain, and you will gather in your grain, your wine, and your oil, and he will give grass in your field for your livestock, and you will eat your fill.

Exodus 23: 10-11

“Six years you shall sow your land and gather in its yield, but the seventh year you shall let it rest and lie fallow so that the poor of your people may eat, and what they leave the wild animals may eat. You shall do the same with your vineyard and with your olive orchard.

The Bible is full of language about farming and caring for our land and animals, I've picked 3 of the many different examples of this. In the Gospels Jesus uses parables and teachings using farming and caring for crops quite often as well. It is very clear that God holds farmers in high regard, and with good reason. As we come out of winter and head into the spring planting season, we are reminded that the hard working and dedicated farm families in our church congregations will sacrifice time with their loved ones, social engagements, and even attendance at our churches so that all God's people can eat. This is a sacred and necessary calling that allows us to enjoy the lifestyles we've become so accustomed to. I often hear excuses about why people can't come to church, I never judge, and I know even I can't be here every single Sunday. I've heard it from farmers as well, and to them I would say that when they are in the field, tilling the earth, caring for God's creation, and making things grow, that they are performing a holy service to their creator. The work they are doing is a form of worship to God in itself. God revels in the love our farmers have for the land and living things. I have said before that church can be whatever you make it, because I believe that God is always with us no matter where we are. Church can just as easily be in the cab of a tractor or in a barn with the animals. Martin Luther once said that “God milks the cows through those whose vocation it is.” We pray this spring season for our farmers, their families, and their loved ones. We pray for a successful season of planting and growing, and that God blesses your crops, your animals, and your farms. Amen

NELC Council Minutes

March 10, 2024

Council Members Present: President Mark Engen, Dan Turner, Pete Antonson, Nancy Hall, Vicar Steve DeKrey, council members-elect Angela Lyste

The council discussed starting the meeting even though there weren't enough for quorum. The team decided to proceed to discuss items, but would be unable to vote or make any motions.

President Mark Engen called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m.

Steve led the council in prayer.

Secretary's report: The minutes from the February 11, 2024 meeting were approved.

Treasurer's report: Nikki had left executive summary as of February 29, 2024. One of the CDs was deposited. Another will be deposited this month. Drew Suby will be getting back to Mark regarding snow removal.

Mark received a quote from Meland Lumber regarding the garage windows at the parsonage. They would charge \$150 for both pieces and the replacement window and they would come put them in. Mark will send out a text to council members to see if there are any concerns or any opposing moving ahead with this.

Mark shared that he had received an email from Deacon Laura about a grant through the Synod to cover internship costs. So far the church has paid \$1,500 so far. Steve thought the application would have a place where you state the amount requested. This would be a way to reimburse what we have already paid and help cover any costs that may arise.

Mark also received an invoice from David Sebekow for all the painting at the parsonage. The total cost was \$1,400. This payment was authorized and Nikki will send out the payment.

Jeff Meland has been working on updating the Church's website. The domain name costs \$45/year and hosting the website costs \$290/year. He waived the Website Development Fee.

Dan brought up having formal pictures taken to update the Directory. We may also want to hire someone to take pictures throughout the 150th

celebration this summer. Nikki Thorsgard, Debbie Korsmo, and Katie Armstrong were all mentioned. Dan will reach out to Katie and Pete will reach out to Debbie and Nikki to see if they would be interested and get an estimate of cost. Pete will also reach out to Robin Lloyd at Ebenezer to see who they used as a photographer for their Directory photos as these were done within the last 5 years.

Bob Bilden joined the meeting. With enough members, Dan motioned approval of February's Council Minutes. Nancy seconded the motion. Approved

Pete motioned for approval of the Treasury report. Nancy seconded the motion. Mark opened up for concerns. Dan questioned the church utilities. The parsonage continues to have a credit on the account. Even Monthly Payments will begin in May for the utility bill. The Treasurer's Report was approved.

Pastor's Report

Lenten services have been well attended at both churches. There have also been a lot of kids showing up and helping out with the meal and bell choir. There have been lots of those coming together and helping out with these services. Last week WELCA served a large funeral and then the supper after. This was a lot of work and was much appreciated! Steve also attended the Rural Ministry Conference. Maundy Thursday service will be March 28 and will include First Communion for our 5th graders. Steve also shared that there will be an event, Feed My Starving Children, on April 25-27. He should be receiving more information soon, but would love to possibly take the youth to participate and possibly some church members.

Dan motioned to vote Angela Lyste as a council member (1-year term) as well as for the Secretary position. Second by Pete. Motion approved.

Next Joint Council Meeting April 14, 12:30 p.m.

Moved the next NELC Council meeting from May 12 (Mother's Day) to May 5th at 1:00 p.m.

President Mark declared the meeting adjourned at 12:45 p.m.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
