From Vicar Steve

Seeing as this is the newsletter for November, you are either reading this right before, during or after the election. No matter where you stand on politics in the United States these last few years, I would venture to guess that you are as tired of them as everyone else is. You may have noticed a weariness in the country in the last 10 or so years. I think coming out of the pandemic of 2020 it became so noticeable that we saw fundamental changes in life and the way organizations operate. We can't find volunteers as easily as we used to for anything. Businesses can't find people to fill jobs, and when they do, the people they hire aren't motivated. The stories are all out there and it seems to be a growing trend. Older generations attribute it to young people being "lazy," but I would push back on that a bit.

As a person in his early forties who works in ministry with people younger than I am quite often, I can tell you that the Millennials and Gen Alpha, as they are called, are not lazy. They are tired. They are tired of a world of constant noise. They are tired of people much older than them deciding things for them about the way the world should work. They are very tired of those people in older generations arguing and fighting about every issue instead of trying to find real solutions.

This is all tied into the political climate of the country and even the world. Imagine being put in a room and isolated and then having the same song played loudly on repeat for days on end. Eventually you learn to tune it out, and eventually you just disengage from reality to get away from it all. Talking heads on 24/7 news stations are sort of like this, and people have learned to just tune it all out and find things that bring them comfort. They retreat into these spaces, so they don't have to face a world that isn't listening to them and doesn't particularly care what they think outside of being a potential voter or a consumer of a product.

This is a cycle of sin that is sapping the very strength from people. Now I understand how strongly people can feel about a given issue, but have you let your strong feelings get in the way of relationships? Are there people you don't talk to anymore because you can't spend five minutes with them before an argument breaks out? Do you find yourself consumed by a constant stream of political or social discourse on your television? If the answer to any of these questions is yes, then you might consider unplugging for a while. You also might consider that you are helping contribute to this cycle of sin that has caused people, especially our young people, to decide they don't want to be a part of anything anymore. If they can't find safe and affirming spaces outside their bubble, they will just retreat further inward.

As people of God, we believe that we were given life by one who delights in us. We are to use our gifts to enrich the world and bring the good news of Jesus Christ to everyone through our words and actions. Right now, I think that is one of the most solemn missions we have as the Christian church. I believe that the Gospel has the power to cut through all the noise and anger and division. I believe that we exist to bring hope and healing to the world and to people who feel like they don't have a place anymore.

Psalms 46 reminds us to "Be still and know that I am God". It may be time to lay down our arms against each other, accept the fact that everyone holds different beliefs, values and positions on issues, and remember that we are all children of God no matter who we are. We cannot let the forces of this world turn us against each other because God loves each and every one of us and the good news is for all God's people. I pray that the God of hope and healing can instill us with the energy of the holy spirit to shake off our tiredness and motivate us serve and love our neighbors no matter who they are. Amen.

President Mark Engen called the meeting to order at 12:21 p.m.

Secretary's report: Minutes from the September 8, 2024 meeting reviewed. Pete made a motion to approve the minutes. Wade second; minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report was shared for both August and September. The operating balance went down \$4,500 from propane prepay. Pete made a motion to approve both reports as-is; Nancy second; These were approved.

Pastor's Report:

Vicar Steve shared that confirmation is off to a good start. Parents/adults from the congregations have been helping out. Church School is also going well. Deb had volunteered to take the younger group. The outdoor worship in September went really well. Church attendance has been steady. Steve attended his Internship Retreat and will be working on his classwork all of this week. He has his first call meeting in November and his approval meeting in December. Steve wanted everyone to just keep in mind that there are several things/programs/activities that are going on in within the churches that may need to be handed off to church members in January if he does leave. He would hate for some of these programs to end just because he leaves.

Committee Reports:

Property & Management:

Mark shared that they no longer make the paper towel rolls needed for our paper towel dispensers. We did receive all new paper towel dispensers for throughout the church, but they will need to be put up. Tree and bush trimming will be taking place this week. Jimmy is bringing a trailer and a high school group is coming on Wednesday. Deb ordered blackout curtains for the youth room upstairs and Steve's office. Mark and Jimmy will also be putting up heat tape on the roof.

NELC President Mark Engen called the meeting to order at 1:09 pm.

Steve opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approved the minutes from the last Joint Council Meeting from July 7, 2024; Pete motioned; Mike second; motion carried.

Treasurer's report was reviewed; NELC will be looking at their budget in November and finalized with the Budget Committee in November/December. Vicar Steve shared that Deb is in need of a new computer and this should be kept in mind when working on the budget. Several members recommended going through Raptor PCS. Mike Loewen is willing to help Deb clean up her current computer. He can also work with Deb to figure out what she would need in new computer.

Mark asked who Washington uses for snow removal as NELC was looking for options. Chris Moore's son did snow removal last year, but wouldn't have the equipment to do NELC. Wade will look into who they use for snow removal at the townhomes.

Call Committee- Washington has elected their 3 members. Cecil shared that the Synod would come out and meet with the committee twice before making the call. NELC will be putting it in the announcements and the newsletter. They hope to have members by the first week in November. Washington will have 3 members and NELC will have 6 members. There are no scheduled meetings yet, but as soon as we have a committee, the Synod will come down to meet with them.

Steve thanked the council for allowing him to take the week to work on his needed assignments. He reminded the council that his internship ends in January. He shared that he would like members to step up and take over the things that both churches have in place. He doesn't want to lose all the things that we have started and have them stop just because his internship is up.

Mark shared that he has had no contact with the Consensus Council, but will contact them to give them an update.

Steve has been using the grant money that was received to make care packages for our local farmers and they have been well received and very much appreciated. There was some money left over from the grant and Thrivent to use to cover the costs for the chili feed on the 23rd.

Parents of the NELC confirmation students have volunteered to do a potluck following the confirmation service on October 27th. The church will provide the cake. Washington is welcome to come and join NELC for the service and potluck to follow.

Steve will meet with Deb to discuss Advent during the week of October 21st. November 17th will be the pancake breakfast at Washington. There will only be one service at 9 am that week at Washington and the pancake breakfast will follow. November 24th is the plan to do the Thanksgiving Meal.

Annual meetings will be held: Washington- January 19th & NELC- January 26th. Pete shared an update from the NELC By-laws Committee. The NELC Committee consists of Pete, Beth Johnson, and John Hutchinson. They cleaned up some of the language and took out portions about tracking communion.
