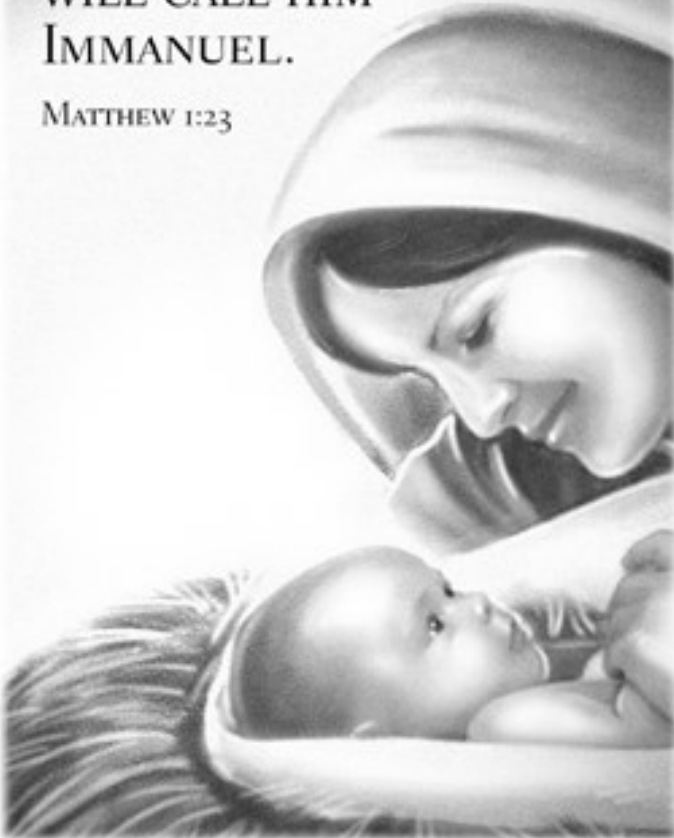

We had a busy morning at Washington putting on Breakfast church and then later in the day I had committed to attending the annual meeting at Red Willow Bible camp. It was a full day that began at 6:30am and ended at 7pm. It's a good thing I listened to my body and took that nap because I needed it. When I woke up, I was alert to drive to Red Willow and bring my full self to that meeting and that space for people.

Jesus sets a wonderful example for us in the Gospels when he retreats to pray or meditate on his own. If its good enough for Jesus, I guess its good enough for us. Whatever will happen tomorrow or in the coming weeks or months should not be where our minds are occupied. How can we be church together right now in this moment? How can we as a church practice a collective pause and lay down some of the "what ifs" that constantly plague us? December is so busy. My hope and prayer for all of you is that you can find some small joys in the quiet moments, be with the ones you love and remember that we never get this time back. Be present. Amen

Joint Council Meeting

Northwood-Washington Lutheran Parish Joint Council Meeting Minutes- November 10, 2024 (unapproved)

Members Present: Mark Engen, Craig Hanson, Nancy Hall, Cecil Tinderholt, Mary Gravdahl, Ed Bina, Nate Korsmo, Nikki Korsmo, Dan Turner, Bob Bilden, Chris Moore, Angela Lyste, and Vicar Steve DeKrey

Members at large: Diane Strom, Desiree McMillan

NELC President Mark Engen called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm.

Steve opened the meeting with a prayer.

Secretary's report- The minutes from the last Joint Council Meeting from October 13, 2024 were reviewed; Dan motioned to approve the minutes; Nancy second; minutes passed.

Treasurer's report was reviewed; Cecil motioned to approve the report; Bob second; report passed.

Vicar Steve shared that the chili feed went well and the youth group made around \$850. He also shared that the wreath order went in, but we did lose some money. The pancake breakfast will be held next Sunday out at Washington. Confirmation and youth group are going well. He also shared that if everything is submitted and approved, he should be getting the okay to graduate in the middle of December and could be interviewing in January. His contract is up January 31st. Steve shared that we have people in the congregation who are capable of carrying out confirmation and would like to see that happen.

Budget- Parsonage insurance will need to be increased in the budget to \$1,500. The council agreed to increase the Parish Assistant's wage to \$18.50/hr which would end up being \$28,700/year. Social Security would also need to be adjusted. Mileage-Parish Assistant will also need to be increased to \$900. Vacation Bible School increases with increasing costs of materials to \$1,200.

Vicar Steve then left the meeting as he is unable to be a part of the following budget discussion. The council felt that the Pastor's salary should start at a base of \$50,000 as we are unsure at this time. Social security will be dependent on the salary. Continuing Education for the Pastor was higher this year given our current situation but could be left at \$1,500 moving forward. Pastor's convention could also be left at \$850. Pension/medical would also go back up to \$28,000. All other items were left the same as proposed for 2024. Chris motioned to send the proposed budget to the annual meeting; Dan second; motion approved.

NELC Council Minutes November 10, 2024 (unapproved)

President Mark Engen called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m.

Steve led prayer.

Secretary's report: Minutes from the October 13, 2024 meeting reviewed. Nancy made a motion to approve the minutes. Ed second; minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report was shared for both October. Nancy made a motion to approve the report; Nate second; Report approved.

Pastor's Report:

Vicar Steve shared that the chili feed went really well and the youth group made around \$850. There were a lot of youth and parents who were there to help out and it was great to see. Wreath sales are over and should be delivered next week. Steve didn't have the exact numbers but thought we lost some money. There will be a pancake breakfast next Sunday at Washington. October 27th there were 7 who were confirmed and this went well. Steven had faculty approval last week and should be approved on November 20th and could have interviews starting in January. His contract ends here January 31st. Steve will need some parents to take over confirmation and can get the information to them so they would be step in for him.

Committee Reports:

Property & Management:

Mark shared that basement paper towel dispensers have been put in. As they are getting emptied out, they are getting replaced so we aren't wasting paper towels. 5 trailer loads of bushes and tree branches were hauled out when they did the clean up around the church. That all went really well. He did mention that there is a tree that is pushing up against a power box that wasn't touched. Dan is going to bring it up at city council meeting to see what to do with it. The heat tape was also put up to help with ice dams. The blackout curtains have not been put up yet. Nate shared that Brian Danzl would fix the drywall and was talking with Deb about what needed to be fixed.

Music & Worship: No report

Education: We will have Confirmation for the 9th grade group on October 27th.

Finance: Nikki shared that we need to remove Suzanne Ellingson's name from the safety deposit box at Bravera. The council agreed that Nikki Korsmo should be added. They also agreed that Pete Antonson should also be added as he is next in line to be president of the council. Nancy motioned to remove Suzanne Ellingson's name from the safety deposit box at Bravera and add Nikki Korsmo and Pete Antonson; Bob second the motion; motion passed.

Old Business:

Call committee members were found and will be meeting after the joint council meeting today. Karl Jodock would be interested in filling one of the council positions. Mark will meet with Scott or Derek in the next few weeks about snow removal.

New Business:

The Sunday school Christmas program will be December 8th at NELC and December 22nd at Washington.

Pancake breakfast at Washington on the 17th
Thanksgiving Dinner on the 24th at NELC from 12-2.
Vicar Steve will be off Wednesday-Friday the week of Thanksgiving.

Budget:

Nikki shared the current budget with the council. - Stewardship had gone over budget. This covers envelopes. Nikki shared that although we use fewer envelopes, the prices have gone up. Council agreed to up the budget of Stewardship to \$350. -Miscellaneous- Was well over budget. Nikki shared that this included our noisy offerings, expenses from our Anniversary celebration, and the Consensus Council cost. Without those three costs, we were only \$800 over budget. Council agreed to leave Miscellaneous budget at \$1000, but would like to look at making noisy offering a separate line item.

-Update Lay delegate to \$800 to cover Hotel room costs as these will rise in the next year.

Next year's total budget \$51,650

Dan made a motion to send the budget to the annual meeting; Ed seconded the motion; Budget will be sent to annual meeting for approval.

Next NELC Council Meeting will be December 8, following church.

President Mark declared the meeting adjourned at 12:55 p.m. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

9:30 am to 12 pm

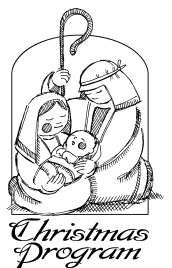
Kids ages 4 -12 are invited to shop at NELC.
