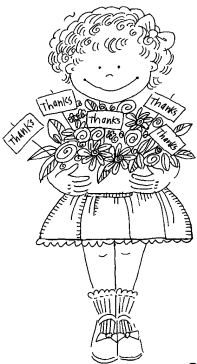

From Pastor Steve

Matthew 5:1-9

5 When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. And he began to speak and taught them, saying:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

"Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

"Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

"Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

If you've listened to me for any amount of time, you know that I stand against violence of any kind. Like most of you, I've grown up with the specter of war and destruction looming over my head ever since I was a little kid. So, when people start lobbing rockets at each other and call it diplomacy, I tend to shrug my shoulders. It's just another day on earth.

I feed the hungry, I give to people in need, I attempt to bring calm and comfort to a world in chaos, and if that makes me seem odd or weak to some people, I would point them to our teacher Jesus who also said that if you live by the sword you will die by it. So, blessed be the peacemakers, and let us all continue to pray for an end to suffering of any kind in this world. Amen.

Sunday, June 15, 2025

President Pete Antonson called the meeting to order at 12:05 p.m.

Pastor Steve opened with a devotion.

Secretary's report: Minutes from the meeting on April 6, 2025 were reviewed. Ed made a motion to approve the minutes; Karl second; Minutes were approved.

Treasurer's report from April and May 2025 were reviewed. Nikki shared that the Neighbor with Neighbor account has been depleted and they are now taking out of account #335. CD will mature on the 26th. Nikki will send out rates to determine if we would like to renew it. Ed made a motion to approve the reports as is; Tim second; April and May reports approved.

Committee Reports:

Property & Management: Sump pump at parsonage was replaced by Mark Engen.

Music & Worship: No Report

Education: VBS is coming up July 14-17 and volunteers are needed to help it run smoothly. There was a registration put out to hopefully get a rough estimate of how many kids will be attending but it is open to the community. The team did meet to talk about VBS and prepare for the session and how to make it successful.

Finance: No report.

Pastor's Report: Recently attended the Synod Assembly in Fargo. Ashley Engen reviewed in church. They discussed, when talking about the budget, making sure to talk about "Why is it important?". This will be helpful moving forward.

Splash Into Faith is coming up on June 26 from 9-4 and they are in need of volunteers.

We will also be collecting bottled water for Spirit Lake reservation who had their water supply contaminated and are in need. We will continue to collect through Friday, June 20 and Steve will find a way to get it delivered.

VBS is coming up on July 14 and we will be in need of volunteers. This year they would like to have one adult paired up with one teen to make sure that everything runs smoothly as well as having multiple volunteers available within the building. We will also be having a volunteer orientation prior to VBS to help out our volunteers.

Steve would also like to apply for the Holy Innovations Grant again. This year he would like to use it for a storytelling group to help share stories of faith within the church. This grant money would be used to purchase books for each of the members of the group as well as materials. Tim motioned to approve applying the Holy Innovations Grant for materials needed for the storytelling group. Ed seconded the motion. Motion was approved to take it to the Joint Council Meeting.

Steve also mentioned that Our Savior's Church in Larimore may need help with their confirmation/youth group this year and would like to reach out to the Bishop to see if this would be needed. The council agreed to take it to the Joint Council Meeting.

Old Business: Received a quote for curtains/blinds for the youth room— for around \$1,000. Tim is also going to check some options at Menards and see if it would be any cheaper and let the Council know.

New Business: Deb is still in need of a new computer. Nikki is going to order a new one from Amazon. This had been previously approved during a joint council meeting. If anything needs to be moved from her current computer, Nikki will be able to help her transfer it.

For the Good of the Parish: Next NELC Council meeting will be July 13th following Church.

Next Joint council meeting will be moved from July 6th to July 13th and will follow regular council meetings.

President Pete declared the meeting adjourned at 12:43 pm.
